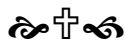

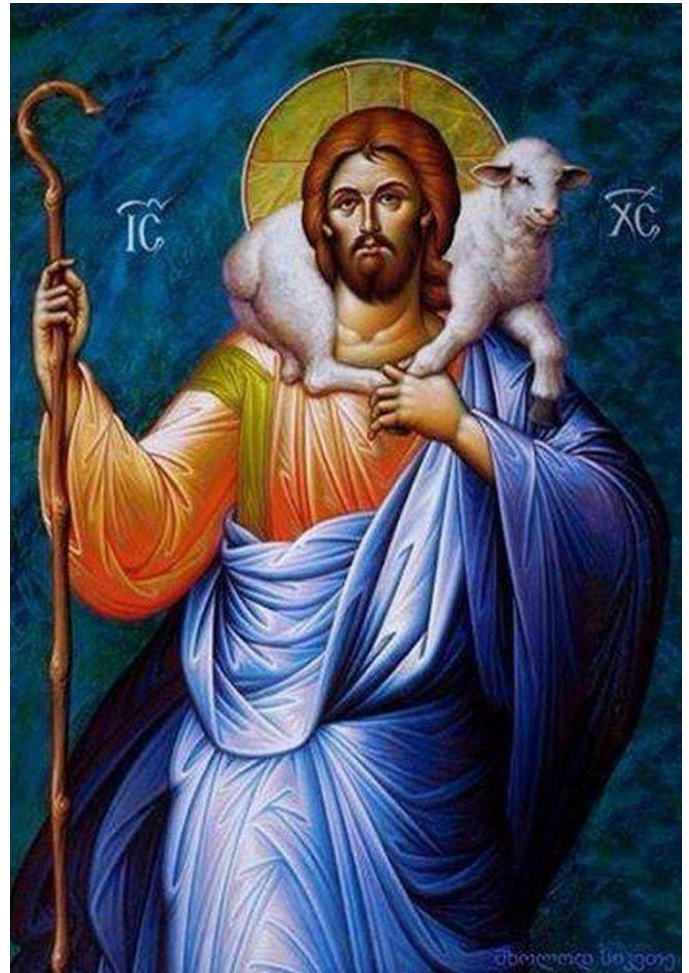
Marriage: Please make an appointment to see the pastor twelve months prior than the intended date of celebration.

Gospel Reflection: *Read Matthew 25:1-46*



Today, on the feast of Christ the King, we read that a ruler or leader should be like a shepherd. The leader is to care for all the people and protect them. And a wise and loving ruler knows that what is important for the people is equally important for their leader.

In today's gospel, the ruler is also a judge. At the last judgment, Christ is pictured as the king who judges the nations. How does he judge? On the basis of care and concern for the needy.

Did you notice in the gospel that all the people were surprised at the king's answer to their questions? How lucky we are to have Jesus tell us what they did not seem to know, that when we do for others, we do to him, and that we will be judged on our works of mercy and justice.

Take a moment to think about these works that the gospel mentions. Ask Christ to reign and rule in your heart and in the whole world.
