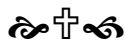

Gospel Reflection: *Matthew 22:15-21*



In the modern, rather individualistic world in which we live, [even during global pandemic], there is a temptation to believe that what we have, we have earned. My possessions are mine, a result of my own hard work or that of others, such as

family. But today's gospel is a good reminder that all we have is from God. As such, we should not and cannot be hoarders of God's good gifts. Even money itself should not be thought of as ours.

Jesus calls us to an entirely new way of thinking [as COVID-19 has called us to new ways of being community]. We return to be fed at the table of his word and at the table of his Eucharist so often in part because we need to be reminded of this way of thinking when we are so immersed in the world with its ways.

Any resources we have are truly not our own. Even what we acquired through our own labor and efforts cannot be taken with us when we pass on from this life. Let us die to the notion of possessions – what is mine versus yours – and let us instead engage in a lifestyle of discipleship, which shares what we have with the least among us. In that way we will be living the paschal mystery.

A note from our pastor - planning for Christmas



Historically, our Mass attendance during the winter is small. However, on Christmas Eve and Day, our churches are full. Christmas family gatherings are a factor in the increase.

This year, Christmas will be celebrated differently due to the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic. In order to keep everyone healthy and safe, family members will have to weigh thoughtfully the risk/benefit of visiting grandma and grandpa, Christmas family reunions, standing in line at airports, etc. Church families must also weigh the risk/benefit of gathering. Public health experts are clear. Large indoor public gatherings in heated spaces with poor ventilation are not advisable.

Christmas Eve is Thursday, December 24th. Christmas Day is Friday, December 25th. These will be followed by Saturday and Sunday, December 26-27, the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. December 28, 29, 30, 31, and January 1, we celebrate the Octave of Christmas and the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. On January 2-3, we celebrate Epiphany.

On these holy days and weekends, we will follow our usual weekend Mass schedule. I am considering adding additional evening Masses during the Christmas Octave. All of these liturgies will feature Christmas scriptures, prayers, and music. The trees will be lit. The poinsettias will be fresh and colorful.

I'm asking you now to help us plan. Share with us your plans and your family plans. Be open to attending Mass on any of the days in the Octave and have that be your Christmas Mass. In this way, we can all attend Mass and receive Communion for Christmas, experience the beauty and joy of Christmas which we all need, and begin the New Year safely and in health. Watch this space for more details about how we will make this happen.

In the meantime, please be smart, be safe, be holy.
